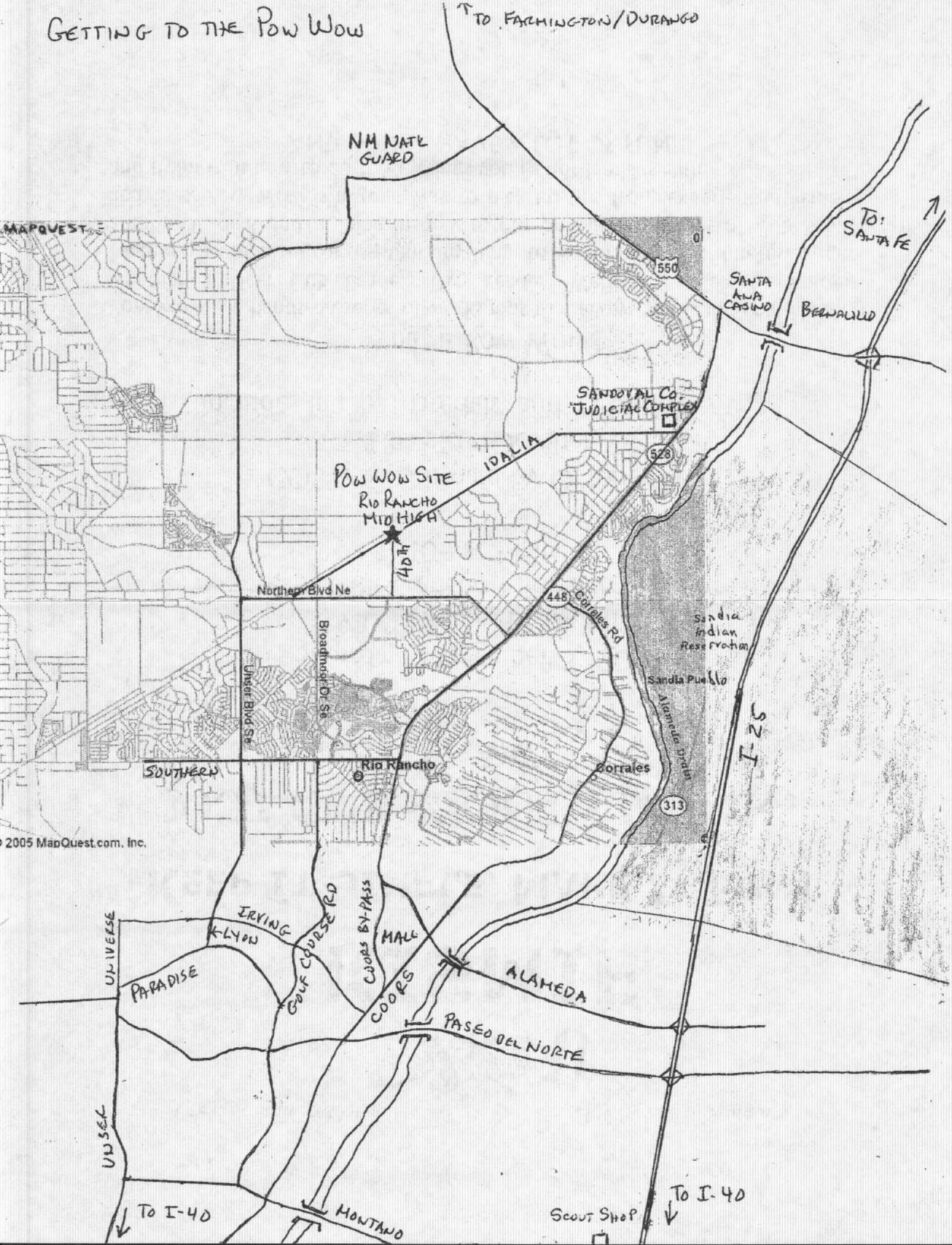

These classes will be taught during Session 1 and repeated in Session 2 unless otherwise noted.

1. **Crafts: Neckerchief slides** – Neckerchief slide ideas and techniques appropriate for Cub Scouts.
2. **Introduction to Dutch Oven cooking and LOTS MORE** – Learn about the basic equipment, safety precautions and some simple recipes, foil cooking, solar cooking and maybe a few surprises.
3. **MUSIC! MUSIC! MUSIC!** – Covers everything from songs to making musical instruments to Cub Bands.
4. **Religious Awards** – Religious awards are available for youth and adult alike. Learn about the resources available.
5. **Cubs w/Disabilities** – You'll learn about the BSA's Cub Scouts with Disabilities program and how it can be implemented in your pack or den.
6. **How Much is TOO Much** – Don't short out the program by overloading the circuits of your leaders.
7. **Flag Protocol** – Not sure about flag protocol and etiquette? Learn the do's and don'ts of flag etiquette, flag ceremonies and related resources.
8. **Crafts: Leather** – Using leather in Cub Scout crafts.
9. **Blue & Gold Banquets** – The ins and outs, hazards and opportunities of this once-a-year Pack activity.
10. **History, Purpose and Organization of Cub Scouting** – Key events in the development of Scouting and Cub Scouting, the purposes of Cub Scouting, the hierarchical structure and who your district and council contacts are.
11. **Crafts: Nature** – Using the great outdoors for crafts.
12. **Skits/Cheers/Run-ons** – What constitutes an appropriate skit, cheer or run-on? Learn why we use skits, cheers and run-ons and where to find resources.
13. **Derby Mania** – Pinewood Derbies, Rain gutter Regattas, and Space Derbies from start to finish.
14. **Tiger Mania** – How to organize a Tiger Den for your Pack.

These classes will be taught during Session 3 and repeated in Session 4 unless otherwise noted.

15. **Ethics in Action/The Core Values** – Using Ethics in Action to teach the Core Values.
16. **Camping w/Cubs** – Want to know about Day Camp, Family Camping or Webelos Week in the Woods? What are your responsibilities and what is acceptable when planning a Cub Scout outdoor activity?
17. **Ceremonies & Recognition** – Handing out awards doesn't have to be just a roll call. Here are some ceremonies that will add dignity and make pack meetings memorable.
18. **Buried Under Paperwork** – Record keeping, permits, safety rules, financing the program and FOS.
19. **Advancement for Cubs** – Learn the changes that have taken place in the recent past.
20. **Consider Your Spouse (and Family)** – Keep your spouse and family from feeling left out by including them. Learn how Cub Scouting can enhance your family life.
21. **Crafts: On a Shoestring & 101 Uses for film canisters** – GREAT crafts; LITTLE cost.
22. **Recruiting & Retaining** – Effective ways to involve parents, leader recognition, advanced training opportunities, district and council help, School Night for Scouting and year round recruiting methods.
23. **Indian Lore** – Indian Crafts and the "dos and don'ts" of what to teach the Scouts.
24. **Nature/Hikes** – Use of nature hikes, stargazing, weather observation and animal and plant habitat studies as tools to meet program goals.
25. **Games** – The role of games in youth development, competition's place in Cub Scouting, theme related games, use gathering games, puzzles, activities and tricks to maintain discipline and interest.
26. **Crafts: Themed crafts** – 6 months of themed crafts to enhance the program helps.
27. **Fly-Fishing** – Learn different techniques of fly-fishing to teach the Scouts

These classes will be taught during Session 5 and repeated in Session 6 unless otherwise noted.

28. **Den & Pack Pizzazz** – Jazzing up the Pack meeting.
29. **Webelos to Scouts Transition** – Learn the importance of Webelos Scout activities to the Boy Scout program, details of the Webelos to Scout Transition, and some ceremony ideas for the Arrow of Light award and bridging from Pack to Troop. Includes updated advancement for Webelos Activity Pins.
30. **Leave No Trace Award, Outdoor Award, World Conservation Award and Conservation Projects** – Learn about these worthwhile awards and some suggested activities appropriate to Cub Scout age youth for completing the award requirements.
31. **Cubmaster's Minute** – Presentation Skills and Body Language – Learn and practice stage presence and effective use of the Cubmaster's Minute.
32. **Crafts: Holiday** – Easy crafts for ALL holidays.
33. **Indoor Cooking** – Simple snack ideas with little or no cooking involved.
34. **Sports & Academics Program** – An introduction to the Sports and Academics Program.
35. **Storytelling** – Storytelling techniques, some example stories, and how they can add to your program and promote Scouting ideals.
36. **Finding Resources** – Publications, people, web sites, and Round Table information sources.
37. **Science w/Cubs** – Hovercraft projects appropriate for all families of Scouting.
38. **Effectively Using Den Chiefs** – Learn where to find a Den Chief and some of the best ways to utilize a Den Chief.
39. **Crafts: Wood** – Learn what tools to use for Cubs and some useful techniques for working with wood.
40. **Communicating with Everyone** – Ways to communicate plans and needs to boys, parents, committee members, district and council leaders using newsletters, telephone trees and news releases.
41. **Crafts: Themed crafts** - 6 months of themed crafts to enhance the program helps. (September – February)
42. **Field Trips** – Out and About in the Great Southwest Council - Field trips are fun and opportunities abound. Learn what BSA's requirements are for taking Cubs on a field trip, how to involve parents and community members.
